Friday · July 5th

Calgary

Tour begins in the province of Alberta, so be ready for an adventure that surrounds the beautiful expanse of the prairies, the "purple mountains' majesty" of the Canadian Rockies, and the breathtaking "postcard" views of Montana's Glacier National Park. At the hotel, mingle with your fellow travelers during a Welcome Cocktail Reception this evening.

Saturday · July 6th

Head-Smashed-In Buffalo Jump & Waterton Lakes National Park

This morning, journey south to the prairie lands while enjoying the distant views of the spectacular Rockies. Visit Head-Smashed-In Buffalo Jump, a UNESCO World Heritage site and one of the world's oldest, best preserved buffalo jumps. Continue traveling south to Waterton Lakes National Park. En route, pass through quaint villages and travel along roads sometimes traversed by grizzly bears, black bears, mountain goats, cougars, wolves, moose and elk. Tonight, enjoy dinner overlooking Waterton Lake. (B,D)

Sunday · July 7th

Glacier National Park

Today, experience Glacier National Park, a naturalist's paradise. Glacier preserves over one million acres of forests, Alpine meadows and lakes, and is home to over 70 species of mammals and 270 species of birds. Enjoy a ride aboard one of its famous Jammer cars – built in the 1930s – along one of the most breathtaking roads in North America. (B)

Monday · July 8th

Banff National Park

Relax during your journey to Banff, and soak in a backdrop of wonderful wildlife and the majestic Canadian Rockies. This afternoon, arrive in Banff and enjoy stops at the powerful Bow Falls and Surprise Corner known for its picture perfect panoramic views. (B,D)

Tuesday · July 9th

Icefields Parkway & Athabasca Glacier

Set out along the unforgettable Icefields Parkway and behold lofty waterfalls, rushing rivers, glacial peaks, imposing cliffs and snowcapped mountain ranges. Stop at the Athabasca Glacier where it's your choice! Choose a fun ride across this mass of glacial ice over 1,000 feet thick, the largest accumulation of ice south of the Arctic Circle - OR- take a walk onto a glass bottom platform at the Glacier Skywalk. This afternoon, stop at stunning Peyto Lake, a glacier-fed lake that evokes pure serenity. Be on the lookout for bears and stately elk on your return to Banff. (B)

Wednesday · July 10th

Chateau Lake Louise

This morning visit the shores of this famous turquoise blue lake and the incomparable Chateau Lake Louise. Enjoy lunch at the Ski Lake Louise Lodge before boarding the gondola, which ascends the mountain in fourteen minutes to a height of 6,850 feet above sea level. Later, enjoy the views of the prairies while en route to Calgary. Join your fellow travelers for a farewell dinner celebrating the end of a memorable trip. (B,L,D)

Thursday · July 11th

Tour Ends & Flight Home

Your adventure comes to a close today, leaving you with a wealth of memories from your outstanding journey to two of the world's most beautiful areas: the incomparable Canadian Rockies and Glacier National Park. (B)

Terms and Conditions

Deposit and Final Payment

A deposit of \$1000 per person + travel protection premium is due upon booking and to secure your reservation. Final payment is due on or before March 15, 2024.

Travel Protection

Travel Protection is optional and available for individuals. Two types of travel protection are available: Worldwide Travel Protector (WTP) and Worldwide Travel Protector with Cancel for Any Reason (CFAR). WTP covers up to 100% of the prepaid, nonrefundable trip cost for a covered medical cancellation; CFAR will provide a 75% refund for any reason OR a 100% refund for a covered medical reason. All travel protection premiums are non-refundable and must be confirmed at the time of registration and first deposit.

Cancellation Penalties with Travel Insured

Should it become necessary for you to cancel or interrupt your trip due to a covered reason as stated in the protection plan, a claim will be filed with Travel Insured International. All cancellations must be received in writing. Cancellations made before March 15, 2024 are subjected to a cancellation administrative fee of \$100 per person and/or protection plan premium.

Cancellation Penalties without or Not Covered by Travel Insured

All cancellations must be received in writing. Cancellations made before March 15, 2024 are subject to a cancellation handling fee of \$100 per person. Cancellations made after March 15, 2024 are non-refundable.

Travel/Health Policy

It is required that persons needing assistance be accompanied by a companion who is capable and totally responsible for providing that assistance. Neither World of Travel nor its suppliers may assist with medications, wheelchairs, or physically lift persons on to transportation vehicles.
